SUBJECT: DBB Management Agenda Recommendations for the Next Term

- During our quarterly meeting on November 17<sup>th</sup>, the DBB presented the outline of a business management agenda for the Department for the next four years. The purpose of this outline is to direct the Department's management energy onto a limited set of initiatives at the core of transformational change. This outline includes several key objectives organized within six main topic areas:
  - Governance and Organization
  - Human Resources
  - Management Information/Financial Operations
  - Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC)
  - Supply Chain/Acquisition Reform
  - Proactive Management of Healthcare
- DBB Task Groups have been formed around each of these areas and I have directed the Task Group leaders to further refine their ideas and present their list of critical objectives to you within the next 30 days.
- The Board members agree strongly that changing the current governance and organizational structure of the Department will be critical to the success of all the individual objectives discussed under the other categories and, as such, believe that governance and organizational transformation should be your highest immediate priority.
- Central to this governance and organizational transformation is the need for a senior leader with the authority to manage the day-to-day business operations of the Department. Several potential options for establishing such a leader were discussed.

	that you have an unusually attractive opportunity to move out on a reenergized
	business transformation agenda for the next term and should use that
