SUBJECT: NATO Manning Tables

- In response to your request for greater fidelity on the manning of NATO billets by nation,' the NATO Command Structure peacetime establishment manning tables are attached (TABs B through G).
- Of note, the top three contributors to NATO's peacetime establishment billets are the United States (16 percent), Germany (11 percent) and the United Kingdom (9 percent). The next tier of contributors, offering between 6 to 7 percent of NATO's manpower, includes Italy, Spain, the Netherlands and Turkey; the remaining nations contribute roughly 1 percent apiece. These percentages hold true regardless of the headquarters, function or mission.
- The attached information paper (TAB A) explains how the tables are constructed. The tables are sorted by country at the attached TABs B through G.

Subject: NATO Manning Tables

1. <u>Purpose</u>. To provide information and explanation on how to read the NATO manning tables provided as Enclosures B through G.

2. Key Points

- Manning tables are tabulated alphabetically by country. Each tab contains spreadsheets that list a nation's billets within each NATO headquarters. Headquarters are sequenced as follows:
 - Allied Command Operations
 - SHAPE
 - JFC HQ Brunssum
 - JFC HQ Naples
 - Joint HQ Lisbon
 - CC-Air HQ Ramstein
 - CC-Air HQ Izmir
 - CC-Land HQ Heidelberg
 - CC-Land HQ Madrid
 - CC-Mar HQ Northwood
 - CC-Mar HQ Naples
 - NATO CIS Service Agency (NCSA) Sectors
 - HQSACT
 - Joint Warfare Center (JWC)
 - Joint Force Training Center (JFTC)
 - Joint Analysis Lessons Learned Centre (JALLC)
 - NATO Undersea Research Centre
- There are several instances where a nation does not possess a billet in a particular HQ. In that case, there is no reference to that HQ in the tab.
- Prior to the first tab in Volume I of the manning tables, there are two tables listing the total number of billets that nations possess in each headquarters and the NATO CIS Service Agency Sectors.




