SUBJECT: GAO REVIEW "READINESS TRENDS OF U.S. GROUND

FORCES"

• Based on a request from Senator Conrad, the GAO began a review to:

- (1) Evaluate the trends during the past three years in reported readiness status of U.S. ground forces, including major Army and Marines Corps combat units.
- (2) Identify the areas or types of units, if any that have experienced readiness problems and identify the factor that contributed to the readiness deficiencies.
- The **GAO** found that Army combat units are reporting slightly lower readiness levels based on: (1) resetting the force, (2) on-going transformation and modularity, and (3) equipment being left in Iraq by Army units scheduled for modularity.
- These data were briefed to Senator Conrad's staff yesterday.
- These slight reductions are due in large part to the on-going modularity of Army units and the arcane "rules" of the current reporting system. Both the GAO and the Army recognize these are not "real" reductions in force capability.
- We are working to implement the new Defense Readiness Reporting System to more accurately reflect true force capability, answering the question "Ready for what?"
