Joseph Luns called Saturday morning, December 8. He said he wanted to see Kissinger Sunday, any time, any place. He said he was concerned about what he's heard about Kissinger's state of mind. He'd like to visit with him alone. He said he hears that Kissinger is intensely disappointed, angry and hurt. Joseph said, even if he has every right to be, he, Joseph, wants to put for him the fact that it has always been so of other countries. That's the way the Dutch felt when the United States pushed them to get rid of Dutch Guinea. It is the way the Brits and the French felt about Suez. It is the nature of an heroic relationship.
