If for some reason, it is considered essential for both the addressee and his principal assistant to be out of the Washington area at the same time, the written approval of the Secretary or Deputy Secretary of Defense should be obtained prior to making permanent plans for the simultaneous absence.

The above policy also applies to the Chiefs of the Military Services.
